Security


24-hour security continues to the end of the fiscal year and is in the 2024 budget. Open hours until spring will be 8 AM to 4 PM.

False cypress 'Plumosa'

The False cypress 'Plumosa', Chamaecyparis pisifera 'Plumosa, belongs to a Genus of evergreens common to Asia and Western United States. The Genus comes in many forms and many species are highly valued for their landscape value, providing year-round colour, disease resistance and relatively easy-care.

There are numerous False cypress in the Public Gardens and the accompanying picture illustrates one identified just to the East of Horticultural Hall.

Interestingly, the term False cypress and cypress are used to describe different genera of coniferous plants and although they share similarities, the false cypress belong to the Chamaecyparis genus and the true cypress belong to the Cupressus genus. Many, but not all true cypress are not hardy in zone 6 in which Halifax resides.

So what is so wonderful about our Japanese False cypress? It is prized for its fine, feathery foliage which gives it a soft and delicate appearance. The foliage typically exhibits various shades of green which contribute to its aesthetic appeal. It is adaptable to various soil conditions and growing conditions and its hardy nature make it a low maintenance plant. The tree is quite versatile and as can be seen in our Public gardens, as it is employed as a specimen tree, in groupings and as a screen.

The different varieties of Chamaecyparis have a large footprint in our gardens and I encourage you to read our Pocket Guide and Map to see what a substantial contribution they make throughout our landscape.


Lighting in the Gardens
